

## Long Legged Birds

### Supplies:

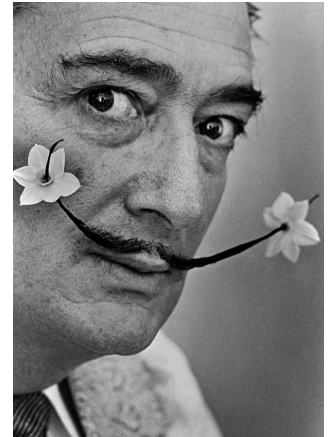
Paper

Scissors

Pencil

Markers, crayons, or colored pencils

This art project is inspired by Salvador Dalí, a Spanish surrealist artist who was known to make imaginative art (and who had a fabulous mustache!). You may know him from his famous painting of melting clocks, which he was inspired to paint when he saw some melting cheese! He was also known to make paintings of long-legged elephants, so here we will be make our own version of long-legged birds.

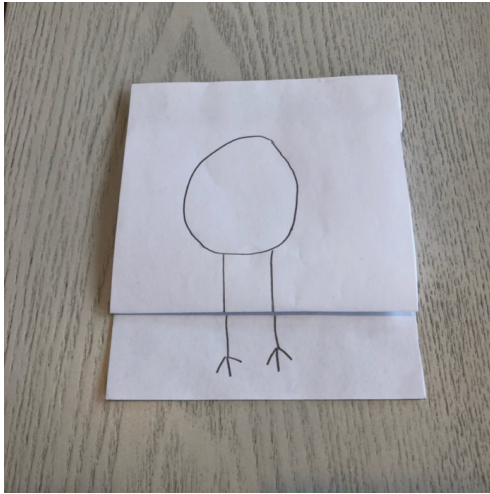


### Instructions:

1. Fold your paper in half the long way (hot dog style).
2. Cut your paper in half along the crease. Now we will use one half to make our drawing.
3. To turn our drawing into a pop-up, we will hold the two ends of the paper and push it together towards the middle so it begins to fold into a "Z" shape. We will leave a little bit of paper poking out of the bottom so we will have room to draw the feet. Make a crease so it stays folded.



4. With your paper still folded, draw a circle above the fold to make your bird's body. Then, draw two lines starting at the bottom of your circle and extending onto the bottom bit of paper poking out from below the fold. Add some feet to the bottom of the legs.



5. Unfold your paper. There will be an empty space in the middle, so we will need to connect the top of the legs to the bottom of the legs by drawing two straight lines.
6. Add a beak to your bird by adding a triangle attached to one side of the circular body. Add a wing by drawing another triangle inside the body.
7. Trace over your pencil drawing with a dark color marker or crayon.



8. Now you get to decorate your bird! Add designs, grass, a sky, and be imaginative!
