## About the Program

At Project Learn, our objective is to provide a sun, safe, and positive environment for children. Our teachers support and encourage building upon:

- The development of a healthy sense of independence and self-motivation.
- Problem-solving and coping skills.
- The ability to establish positive and rewarding relationships with children and adults.

Each day, children are provided opportunities to create, explore, socialize, exercise, and more!

Our program will be open on many early release days in coordination with the Woburn Public Schools. Please refer to the Parent/Caregiver handbook for a list of scheduled closures.

## Registration

Enrollment is limited and takes place on a first come, first served basis. A registration fee of \$50 is due with your registration form to secure your spot. This fee is non-refundable.

## Monthly Tuition Rates

2 Days/week: \$210      4 Days/week: \$375  
3 Days/week: \$315      5 Days/week: \$400

\*we have a 2 day minimum

A 5% sibling discount is offered to those households enrolling more than one child in Project Learn Childcare.

There is a 30 day written notice when changing your schedule.

Childcare vouchers are accepted from those families who qualify.

## About Our Staff

Project Learn is proud of its caring and energetic staff. All staff participate in a selective interview process that includes CORI, DCF, SORI, and fingerprinting background checks. Additionally, each staff member is trained in both CPR and first aid. They are role models who receive ongoing training in the areas of child development, behavior management, and program planning.

## What We Do

Project Learn has been intentionally designed by the Boys & Girls Club to best serve the needs of our students. The Club maintains an excellent relationship and ongoing communication with the Woburn Public Schools' personnel.

## Sample Daily Schedule

### 2:40 Dismissal/Snack/Free Play

*Children meet their Project Learn teachers in the school cafeteria to check in and are provided with a healthy snack. This time is also used for children to unwind and play together after finishing a busy school day.*

### 3:15 Outside/Gym

*It's important to use that each child gets regular exercise, either outside or in the gym.*

### 4:15 Daily Activity

*Each day brings something new. Science experiments, art projects, and even community service are all part of the fun.*

### 4:45 Homework Support

*Children will receive individual assistance with daily assignments. For those who want to attend, homework support will take place in a quiet space until 5:30.*

### 5:00 Free Play

*Children are given another opportunity to make choices independently or with friends.*

### 5:30 Clean Up/Dismissal

*All students must be picked up before 5:45pm each day.*
